

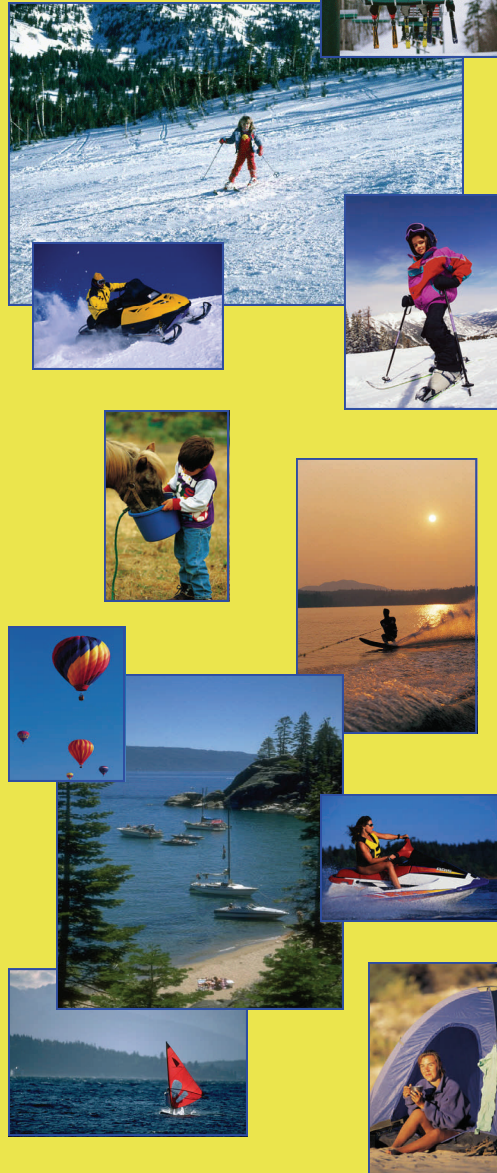

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# Philosophy

Nevada's mission is to provide services at the least restrictive and most appropriate level of care possible, by utilizing the Wraparound service delivery model that helps children and their families succeed wherever they live. Child and Family Teams, an integral part of the wraparound process, involve front-line decision makers in promoting individualized, family focused, community-based, and culturally competent behavioral health services.

# System of Care

Nevada is building a statewide, community-based system of care. The Nevada system of care embraces the values of an integrated, collaborative behavioral health care system that is designed to best serve the needs of Nevada's children and families. Nevada has regional Children's Mental Health Consortia with a wide variety of stakeholders that drive system of care development. Nevada developed neighborhood centers that provide one-stop shops for families seeking services. Key partners in system of care development are mental health, Medicaid, developmental services, early childhood services, education, child welfare, juvenile justice, and families.

# Commitment

Nevada is searching for agencies and professionals that put children and youth at the top of their organizational priorities. Nevada is recruiting providers that can deliver behavioral health services to children and youth with multiple diagnoses. Nevada is looking to recruit providers with:
